



Classical Guitar Harmonic Minor Scales

Numbers near notes = left hand fingers

Numbers within circles = strings

Two Octave Harmonic Minor Scales (root on 5th string)

(Example in C minor, but fingering may be used in Bb, B, C, C#/Db, D, and D#/Eb minor)

Three Octave Harmonic Minor Scales (root on 6th string)

(Example in G minor, but fingering may be used in F, F#/Gb, G, G#/Ab, A, A#/Bb, and B minor)

Three Octave E Harmonic Minor Scale (root on 6th String)
